Woman, Afoot, Killed in Crash

Mother of 7, Going to Church, Hit as Cars Leap Curb

Mrs. Josephine Kuzma, 40, of 1213
Midland av., mother of seven children, was on her way to attend Palm
Sunday services at St. Josaphat's
church Sunday morning, with a
prayer book and rosary in her hand.

At Midland and Cleveland avs. two automobiles collided, both machines leaping the curb. Mrs. Kuzma, crushed between a contrete lamp post and the radiator of one car, was killed.

Two occupants of one of the machines were severely injured. They are Mrs. Irene Koschilnek, 27. of 1166 Second av., who suffered a fractured collarbone and ribs, and Mrs. Eliza, beth Smith, 24. of 1715 State st., cut. and bruised on the head.

In Frenzy, Attacks Driver
Stanley Kumma, hearing the crash
and seeing the crowd Inn to the
scene He pressed through the crowd
and found that his wife was the victim. In his frenzy he attacked Atthur,
Kaczmarck, 19, of 1480 Ninth av.,
driver of the death car. The two were

separated by a policeman.

Kaczmarek and William R. Smith,
40, of 1715 State st., driver of the
other machine, were questioned by
the police for several hours and released for further questioning by the
district attorney's office. Dist. Atty.
George A. Bowman later released
them until the inquest.

The automobile driven by Kacz-marek, who was alone in his machine, was southbound on Midland av. Smith was headed west on Cleveland av. The machines, witnesses said, were traveling fast. Each tried to swerve to avoid hitting the other.

Knocks Down Billboard

The cars sideswiped and plunged across the sideswik. The Smith automobile knocked down a biliboard and stopped in a vicant lot.

"More than 100 persons, mainly worshipers on their way to and from church, collected at the accident scene. Patrolmen Clarence Reise and Paul Stachwiski kept the curious

from pushing too close.

It was with dimeulty that the Kaczmarck automobile was shoved back to release Mrs. Kuzma. She was faken in a south side police ambulance to the county emergency hospital but was dead on arrival.
